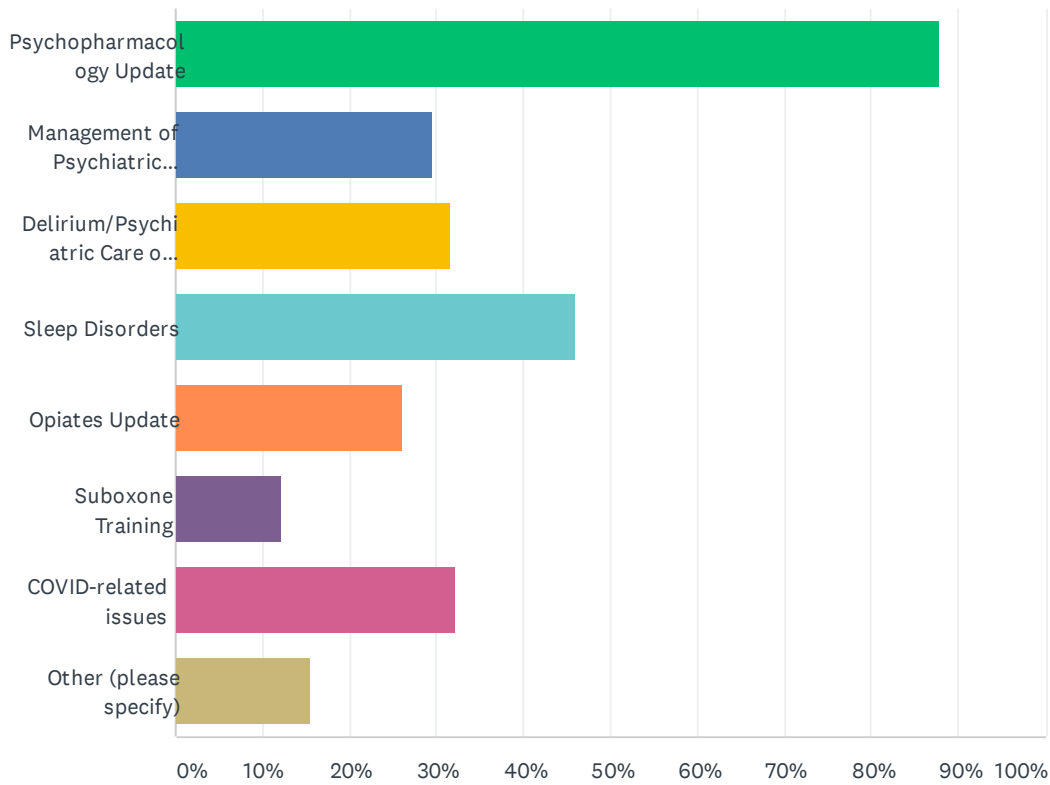

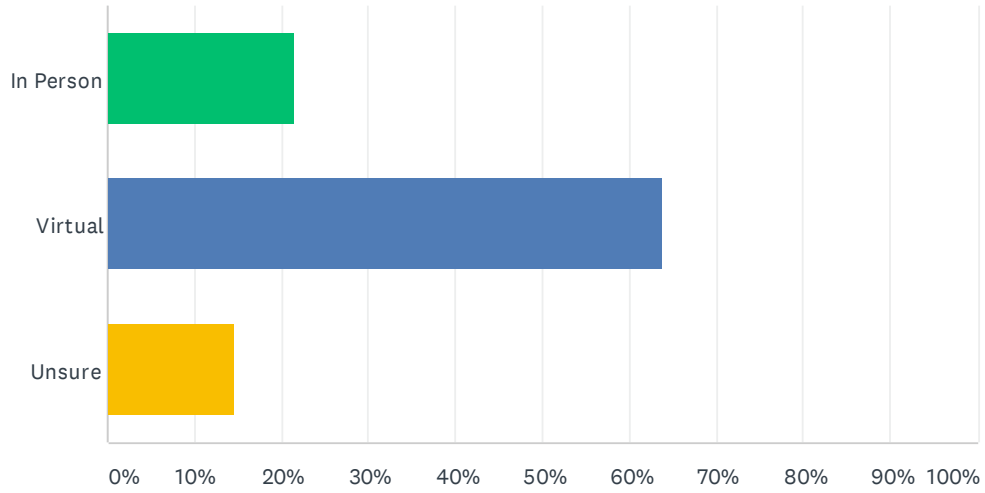

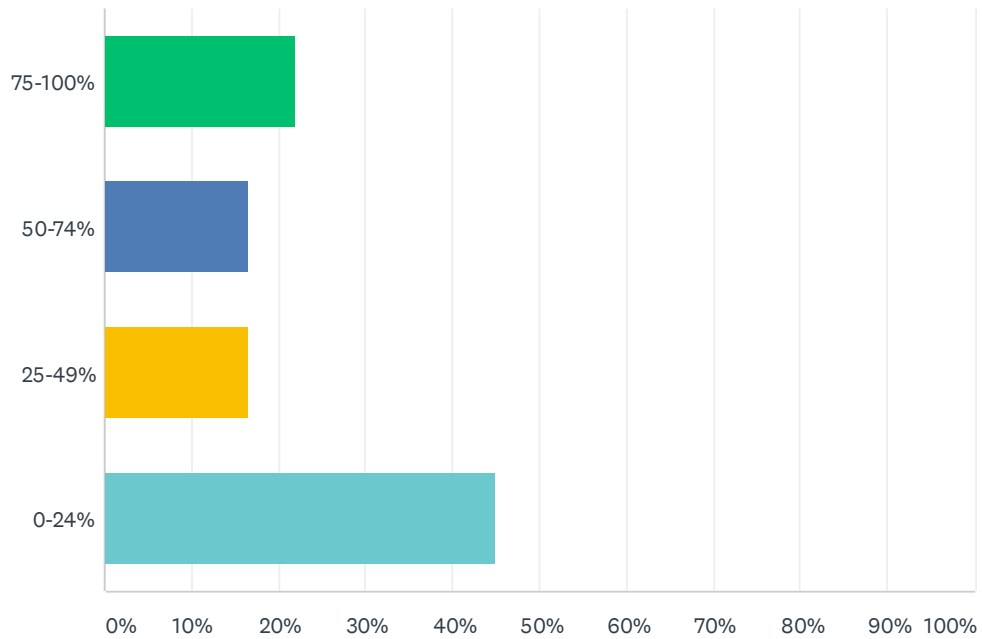

## Q4 For The Past Year, What Percentage of Your CME Credits Are From Online Meetings?

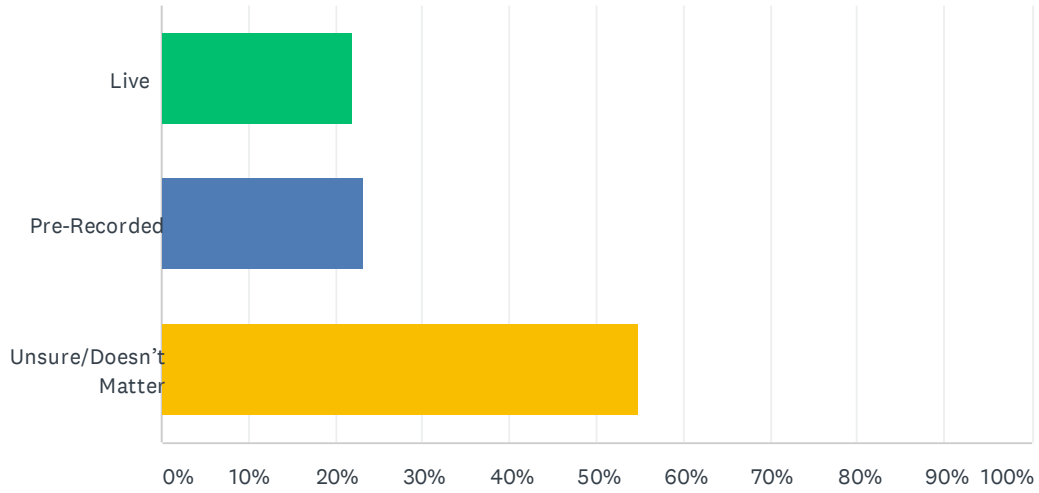

### Q5 If Attending A Virtual CME Meeting, Do You Prefer:

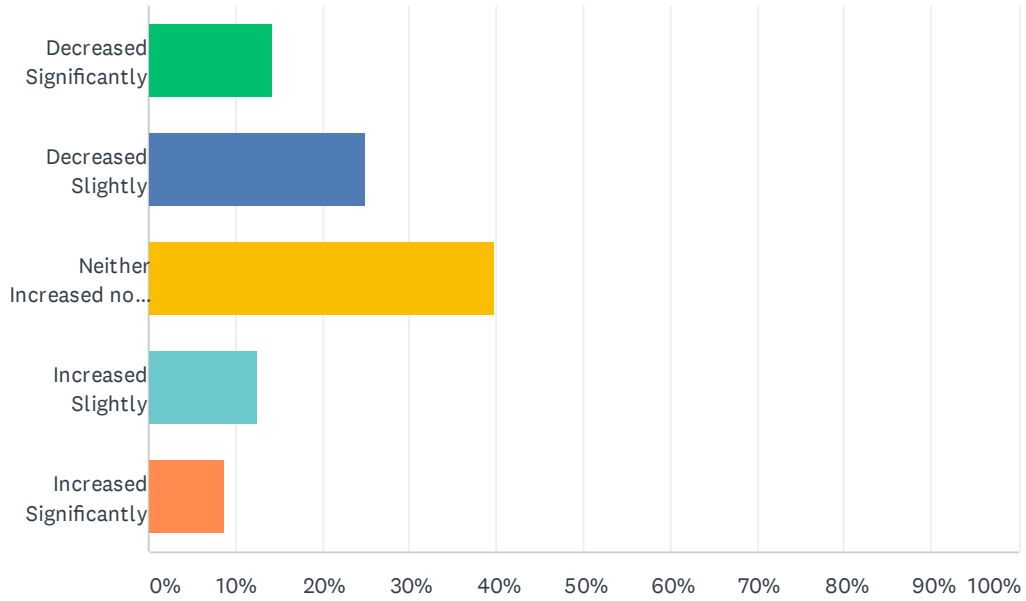

## Q6 Since COVID-19 Have Your Practice Hours:

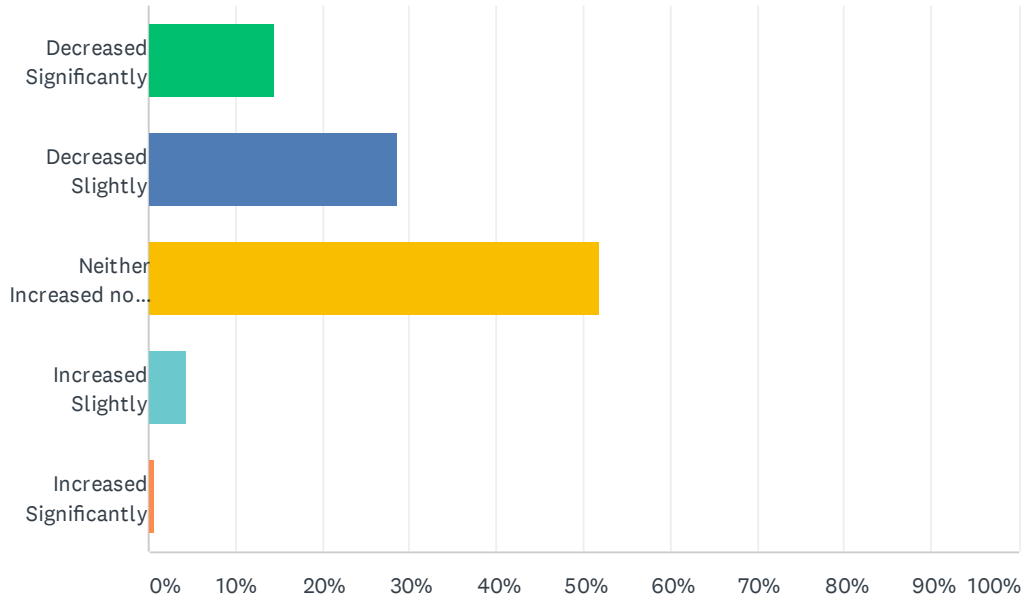

## Q7 Since COVID-19 Has Your Practice Income:

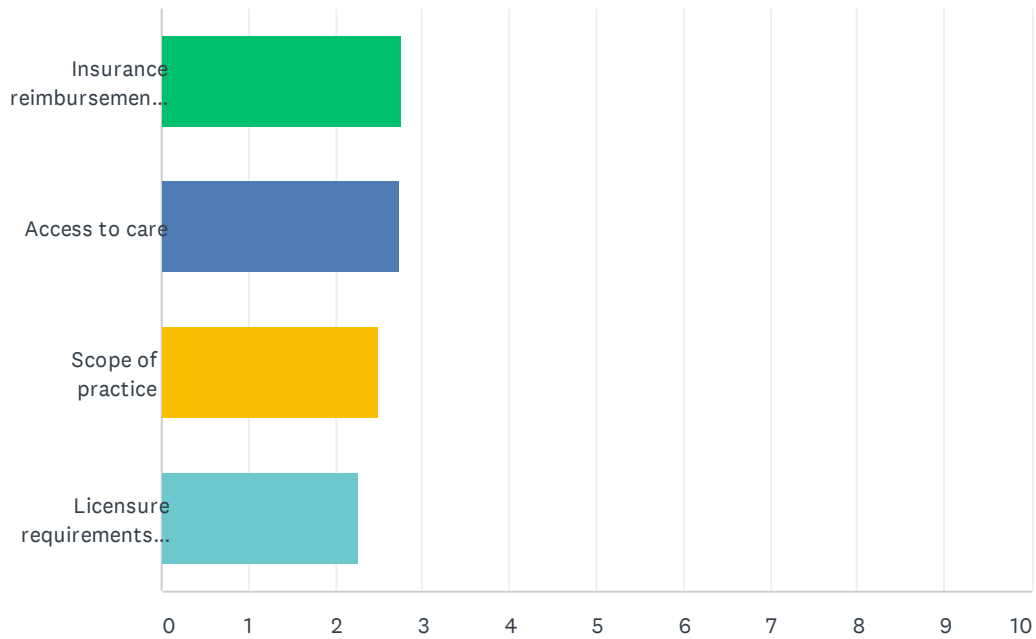

## Q8 Please Rank Your Legislative and Advocacy Priorities in Order of Preference: (1=most important)

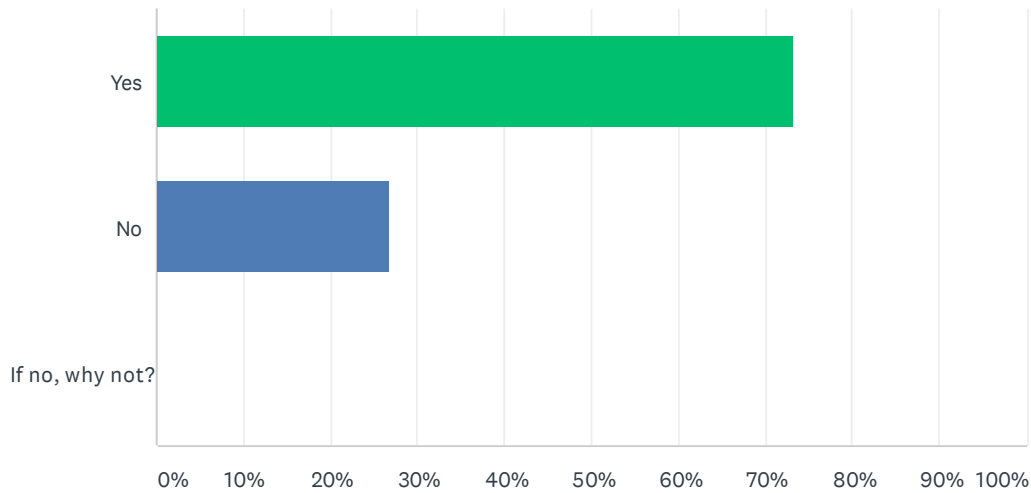

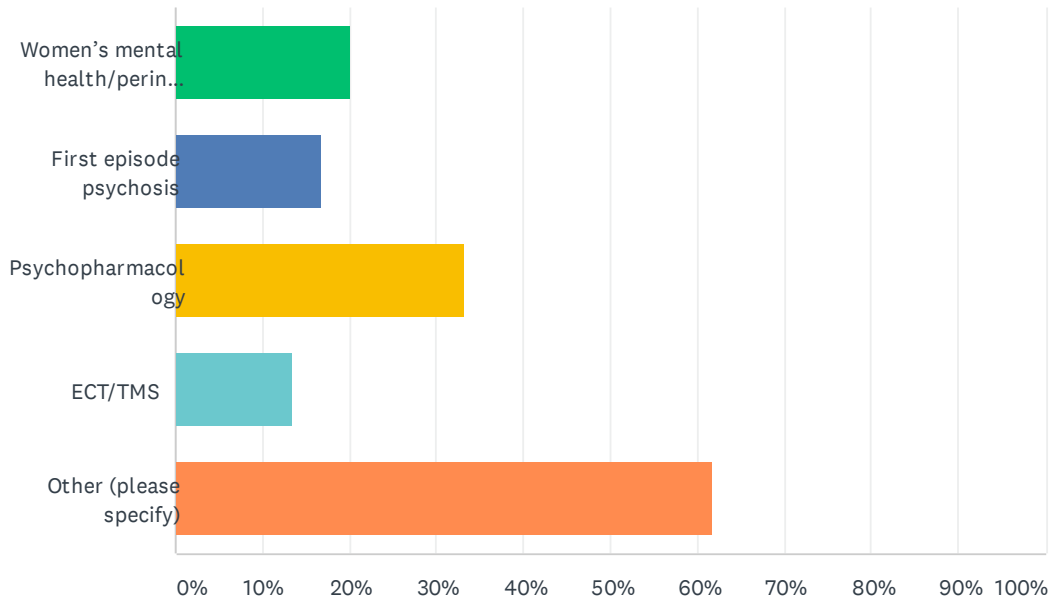

## Q14 What is Your Overall Level of Satisfaction with the MPS?

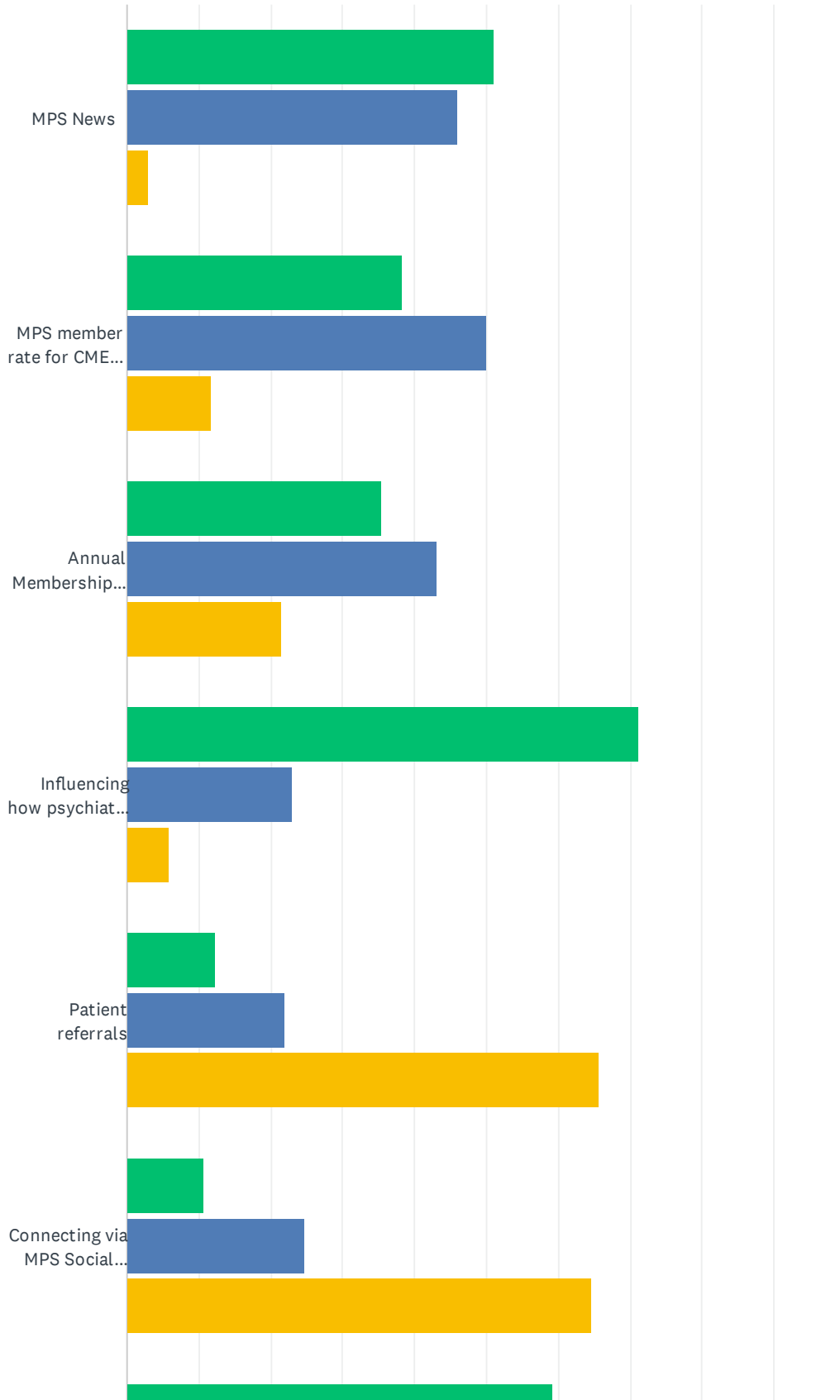

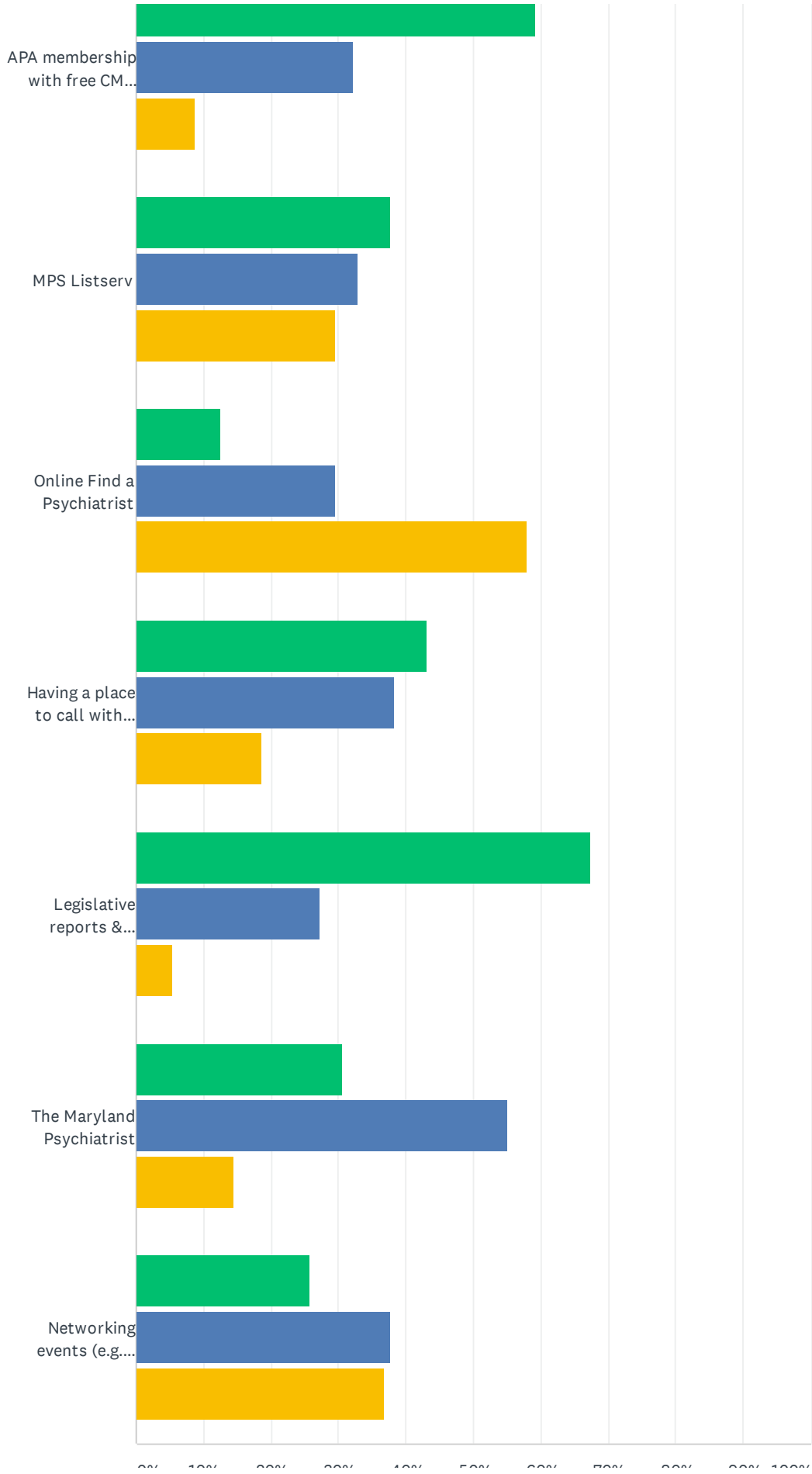

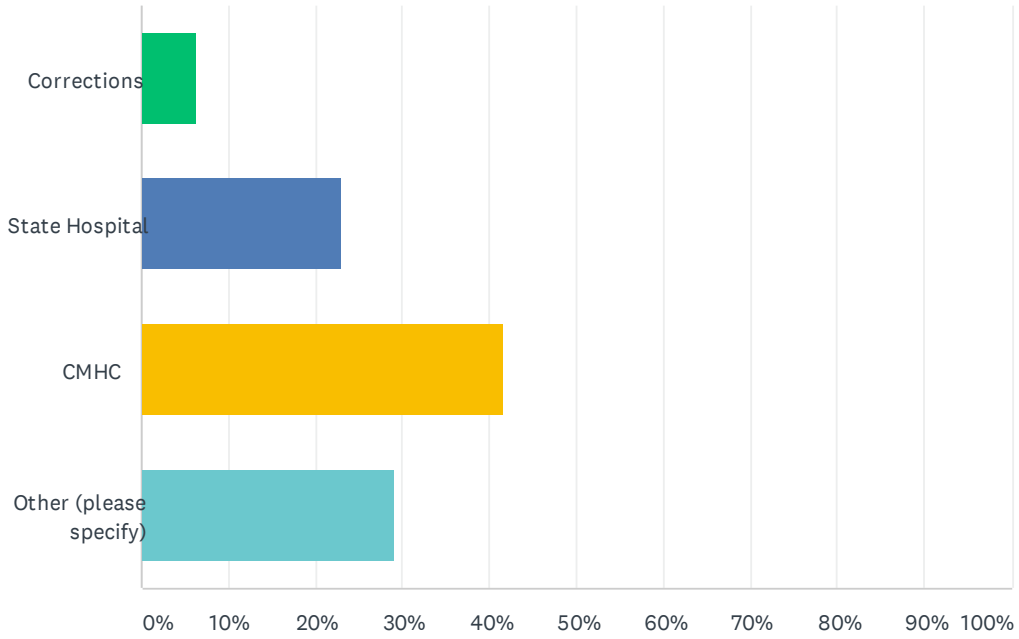

## Q21 How Long Have You Been In Practice?

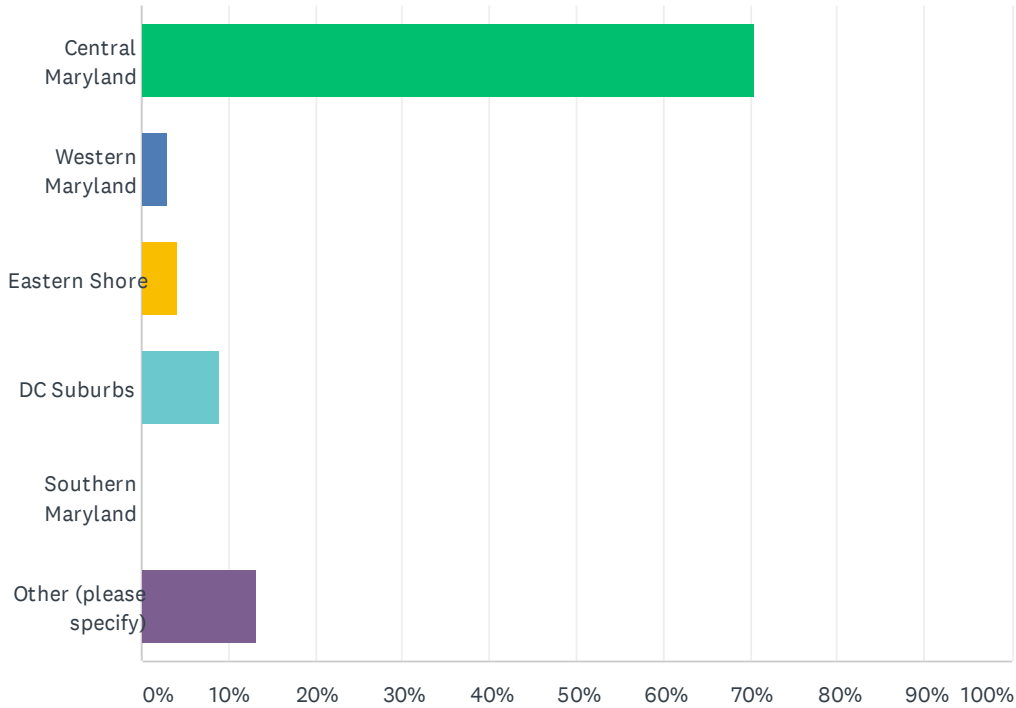
