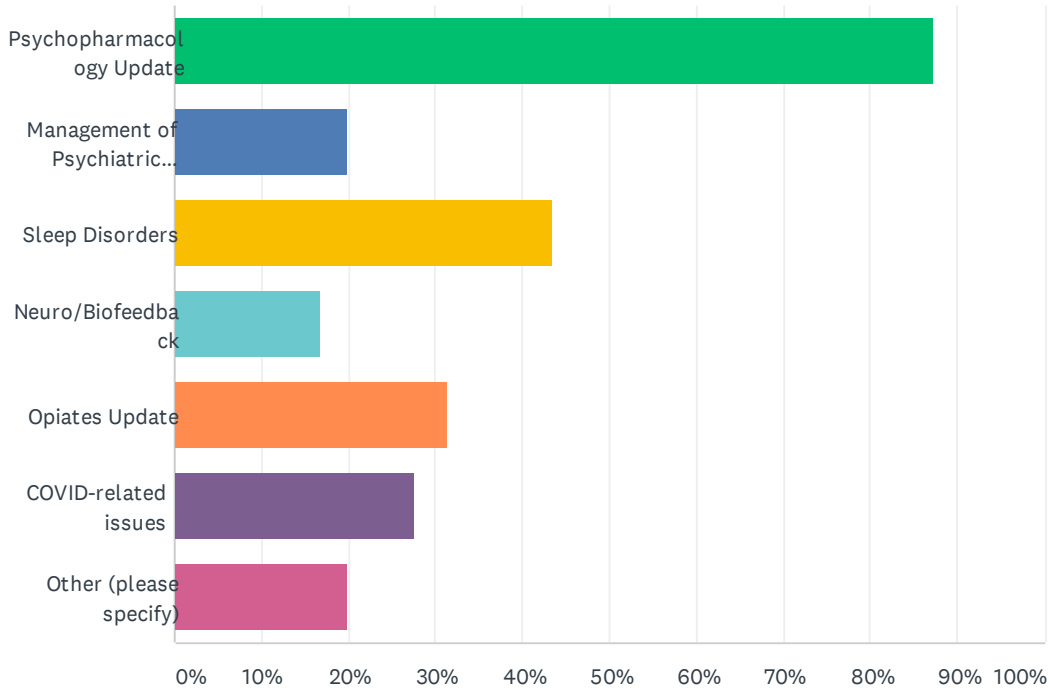

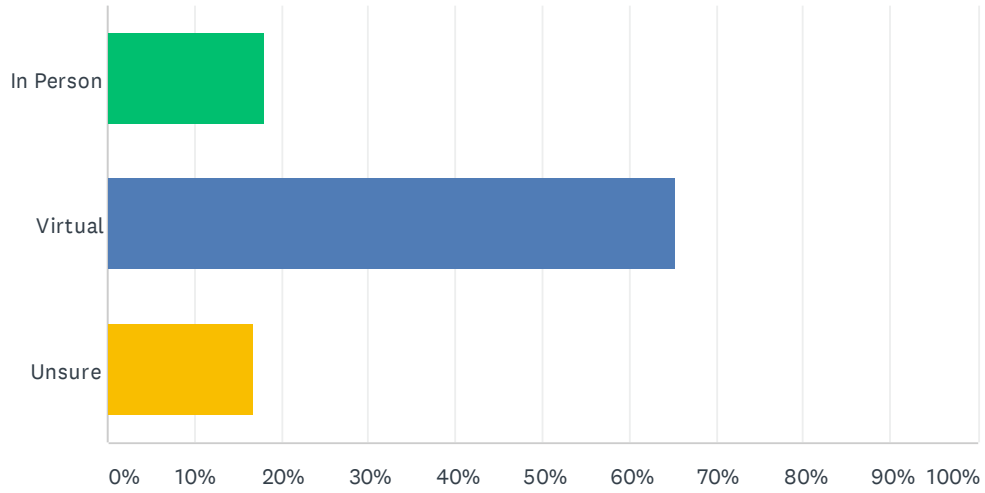

### Q3 What Type of CME Meeting Are You Most Likely To Attend?

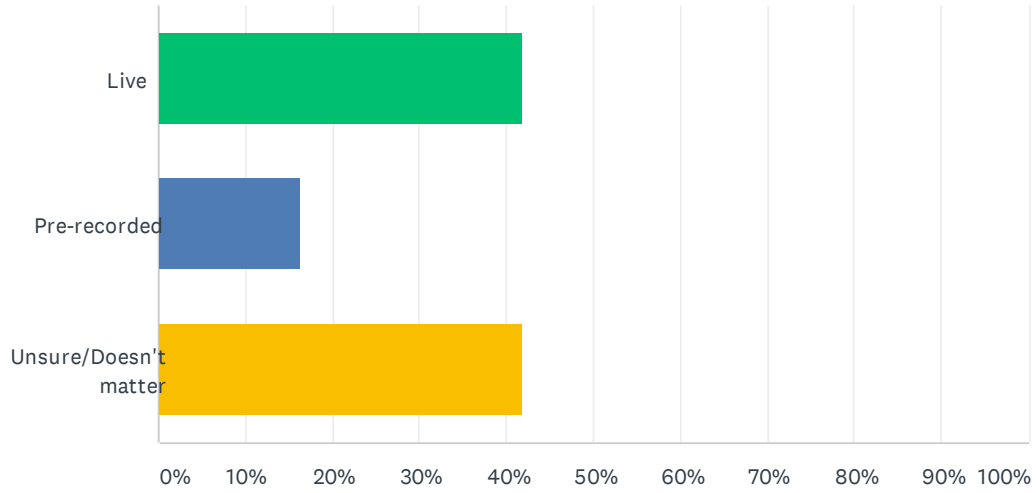

## Q4 If Attending a Virtual Meeting, Do You Prefer?

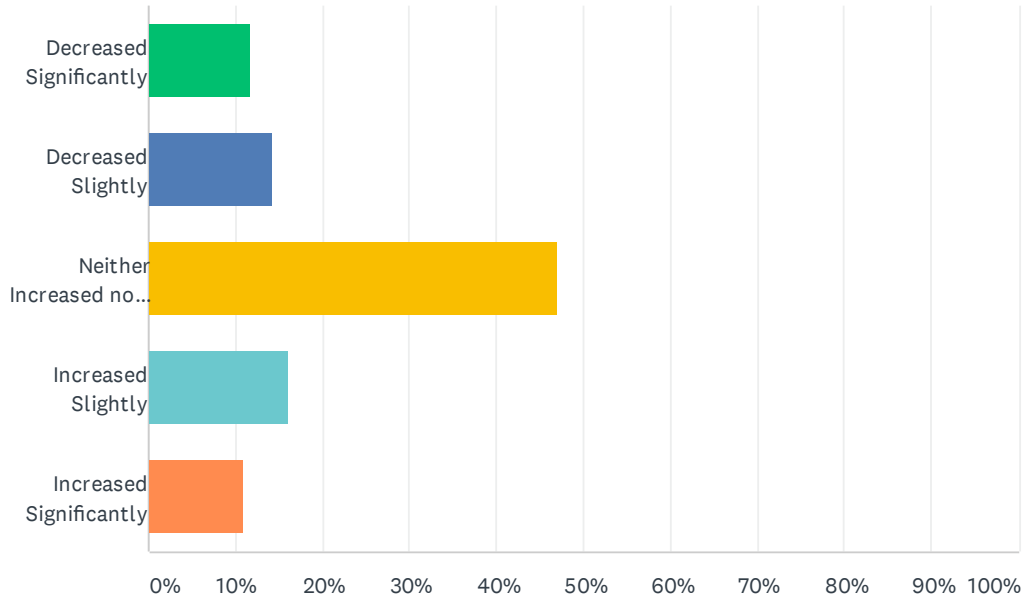

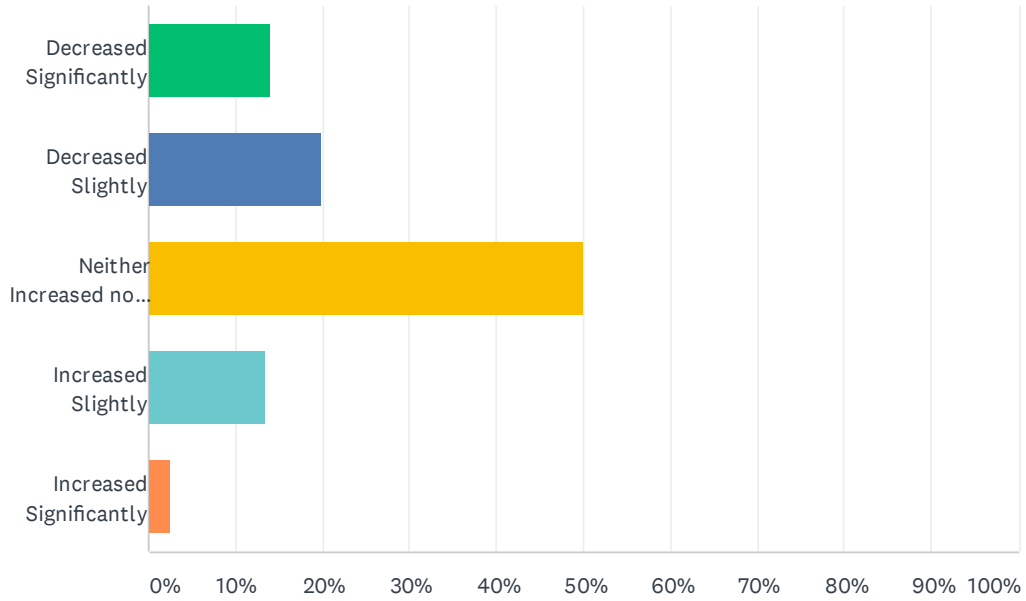

## Q6 Since COVID-19 Has Your Practice Income:

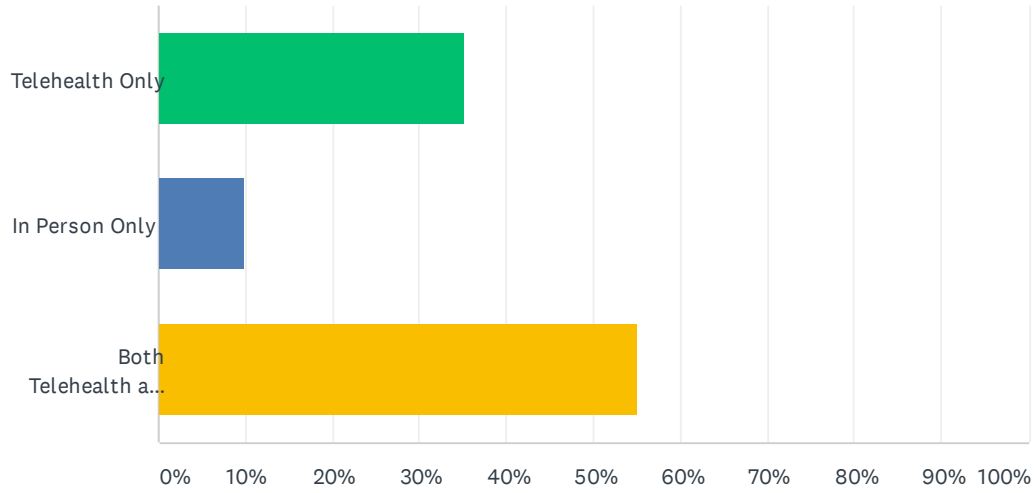

## Q7 Are You Currently Seeing Patients Via:

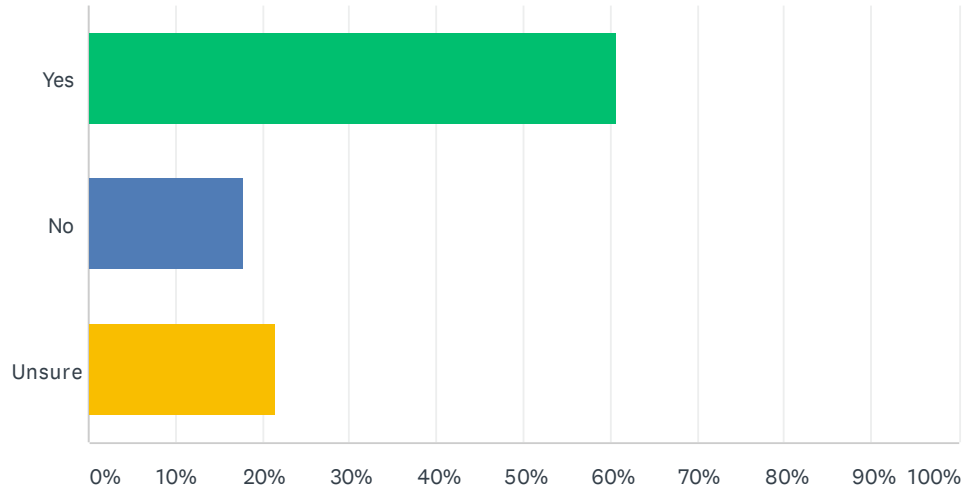

## Q8 Private Practice Members: Are You Maintaining an Office And Renewing Your Lease?

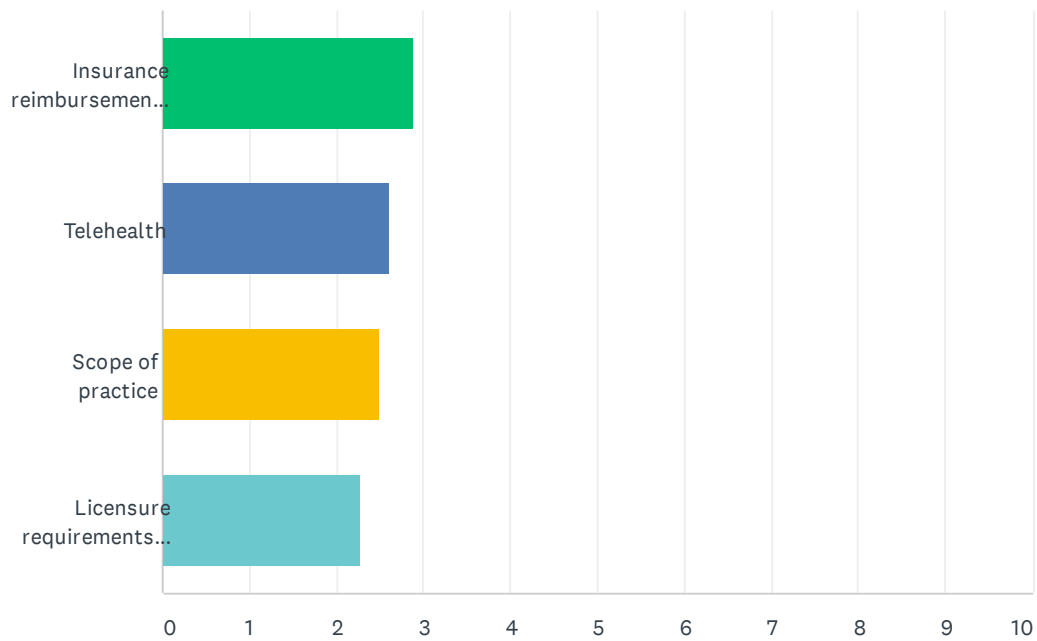

## Q9 Please Rank Your Legislative and Advocacy Priorities in Order of Preference: (1=most important)

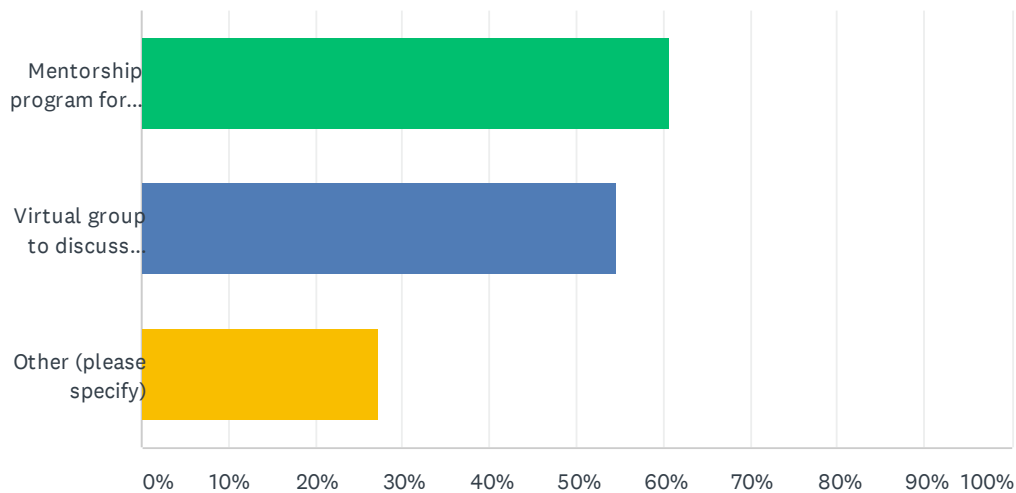

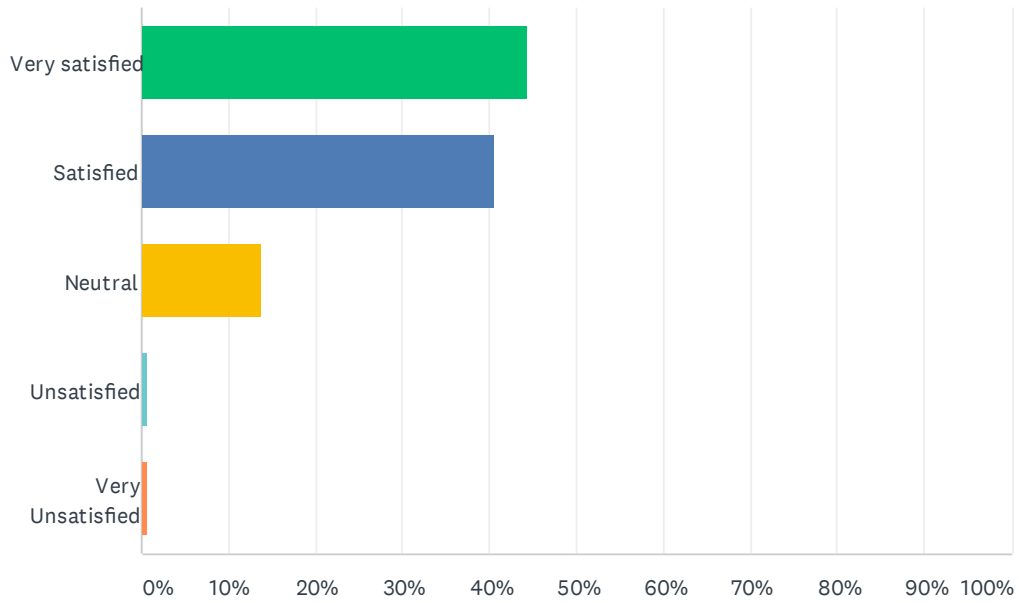

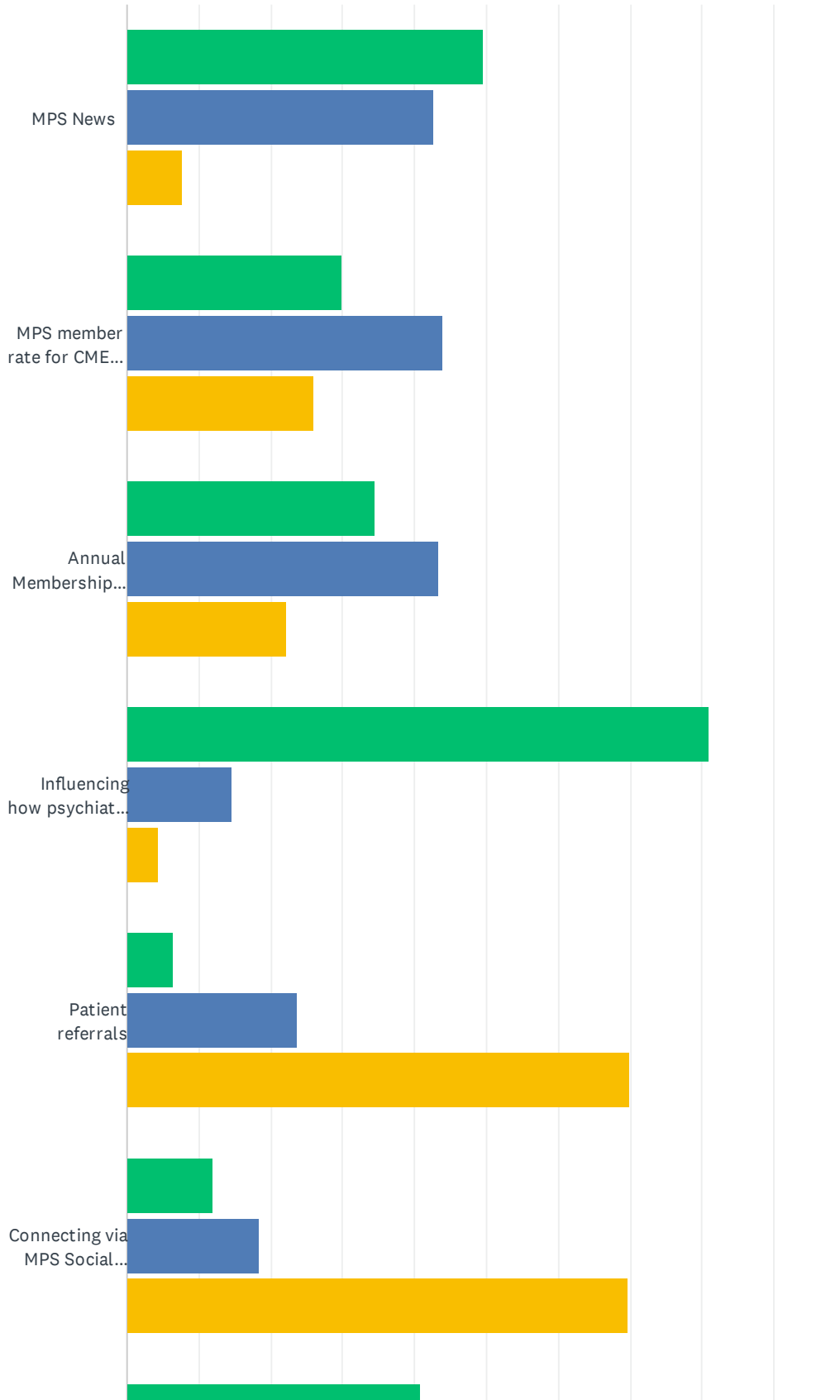

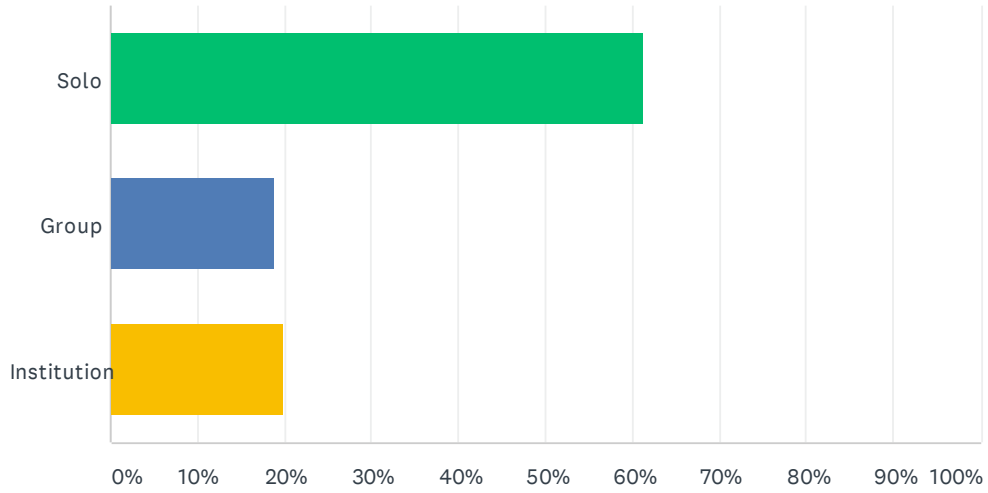

## Q17 If You Work In Private Practice, Is It

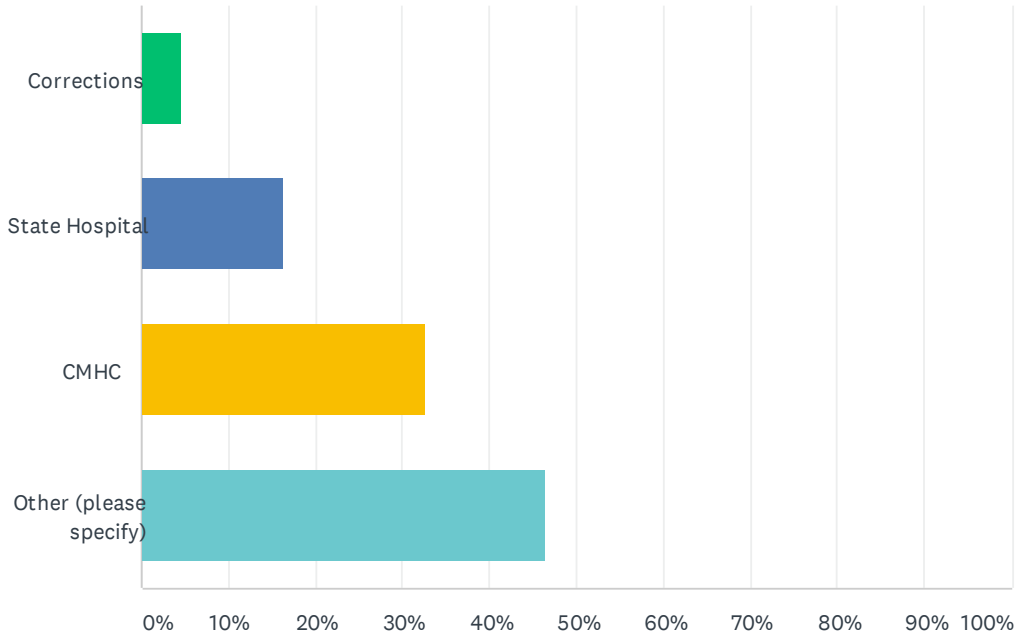

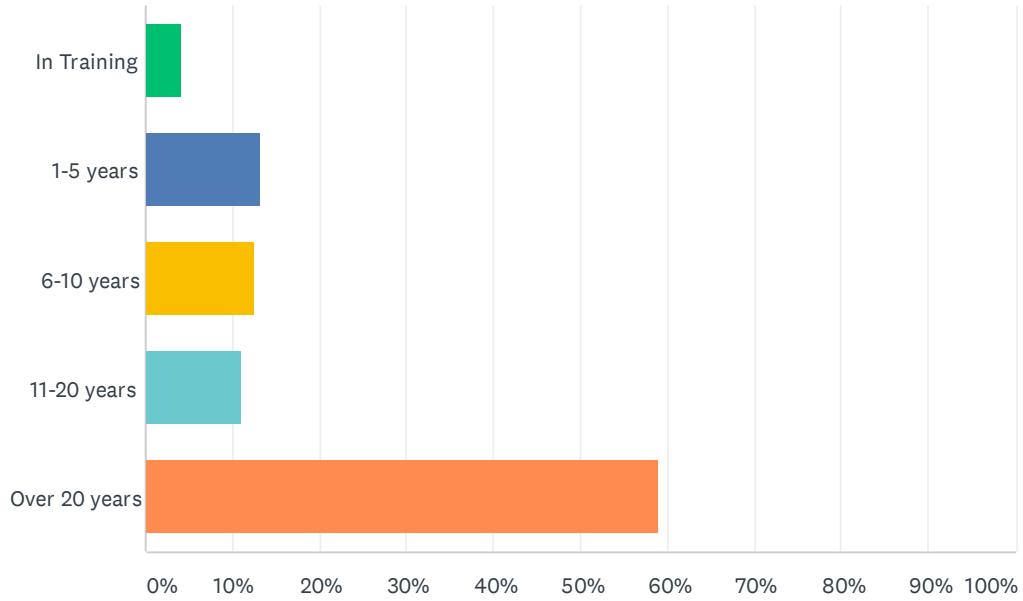

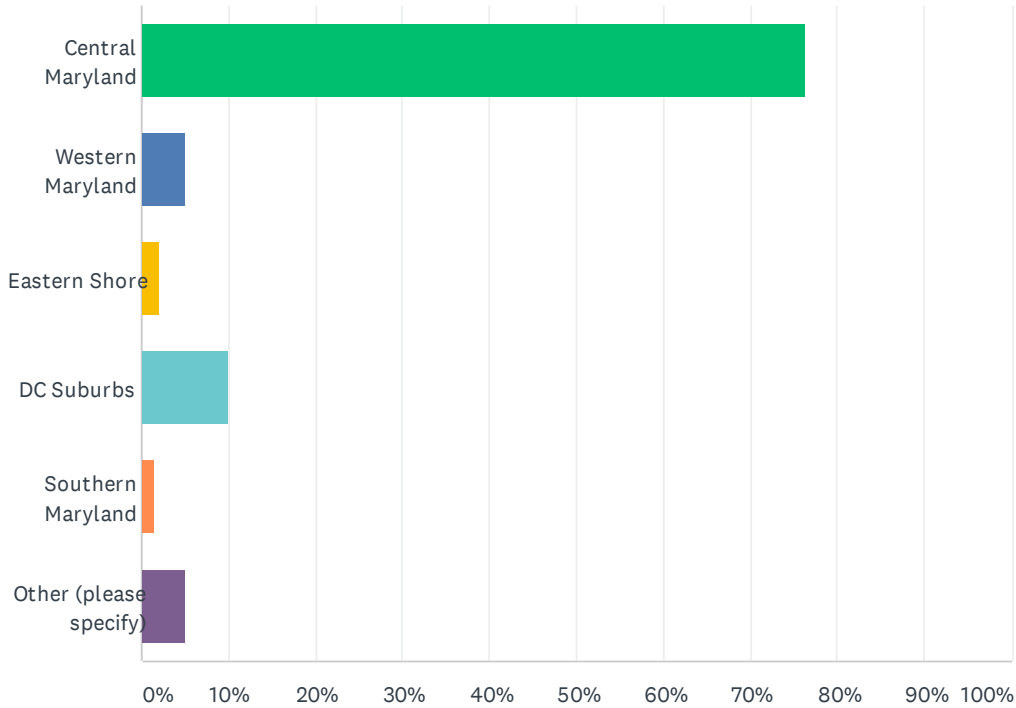
